The Principal's word

Kia ora koutou

Welcome back to term 4 a time that is typically a very busy time for us all. For Senior students there is now only four school weeks before their external exams therefore it is essential that their time is used most effectively to enable them to focus on exam preparation to an appropriate level. Senior teachers have all been talking to students about the revision programmes they should now be undertaking. We hope that the helpful advice given in reports and the Report Interview evening is now being put into action.

In assembly on Monday I spoke to students' about the power of small things'. Getting noticed in a meaningful way is less about the grand gesture or big noticeable things that we may do and more about the small, thoughtful things we do everyday. There's often a pay-it-forward good feeling about doing those extra things. It can be as easy as writing a thank you note that isn't expected, assisting a fellow student with something they don't understand in class, or holding the door open for someone. Too often we assume that being competitive and being considerate are mutually exclusive. I believe that the opposite is true and that we can and should be both competitive in striving for personal excellence and considerate towards others.

Congratulations to James Morgan on his fantastic results in the New Zealand Secondary Schools Clay Target Competition. James travelled to Hamilton with the Waimate High School trapshooters to compete against 350 plus shooters. This was a three day event starting with North Island D.T.L which includes Single Rise,

Points Score and Single Barrel. In this event James was placed first in the Single Rise.

The second day was Nationals D.T.L where he gained fifth in the Single Rise.

On the third day James was part of the Fish and Game Regional Teams Event along with four other shooters from the central South Island region. The team was placed second in this event.



James's success continued with the North Island Skeet in which he was placed first. He was also placed second with his team mate, Simon Davis in the Two-Man team's event.

After a shoot off with 6 other shooters he was the only person left to not drop a target and was Highest Overall, winning the National Skeet title. The title was a deserved reward for James who shot brilliantly throughout the three day competition.

James was a member of the South Island Three Man Skeet Team which competed against the North Island team, another win!

The third trophy James brought home was the Rooney Family Trophy for the High Gun of the North Island events. James's score over the four events was 103 out of 105.

Congratulations to Sam Keenan on his outstanding achievements at the National Gymnastics Championships during the holidays.

On the first day of competitions Sam was 5th in the Floor, 3rd in Pommel and 1st in Rings. In the Finals he was 6th in the Floor, 4th in Rings and 1st in Pommel. This means that Sam is the New Zealand Champion for Pommel in Grade 7. Well done Sam!



Congratulations to Theo and Cornelius van Booma who competed in the South Island Secondary Schools Mountain Biking Championships in Blenheim during the holidays. Theo was placed 25th in the senior class and Cornelius 22nd in the Juniors out of a total field of about 180 riders.

Otago Daily Times EXTRA Social Studies Quiz 2009

Eight teams from Waimate High School competed successfully in the EXTRA quiz run by the Otago Daily Times. It was pleasing to see the enthusiasm and interest shown by the students as they eagerly demonstrated their knowledge and understanding of current issues.

The leading Year 7 & 8 team, consisting of Arthur Campbell, Tome Keenan and Bailey Sivis, scored 91 marks out of a possible 100 correct and placed fifth equal, 5 points behind the winners, Ashburton Intermediate. Other good performances came from the team of Elliot Wilson, Laura Rowley and Dylan White with 86 marks and the Y7 team of Lola Stoodley, Cameron Fletcher and Mary Jane Ainsworth with 83 marks.

In the Y 9 & 10 competitions our two top teams were right up with the leaders until the 'What am I' question where after submitting an answer too quickly they ended up with zero instead of a possible five marks. Nevertheless the top Waimate team of Stafford Dennison, Malcolm Elderton and Reuben Storr finished in fifth place with 87 marks out of 100 just 6 points behind the overall winners. The next best team was that of Nathan Williams, Lachie Robertson and Ben Richards with 83.

Thanks must go to Mrs Geaney for her organisational work and also the parents who provided transport. The reward of seeing our students compete successfully against much larger schools makes it worthwhile. Thanks also to the Otago Daily Times for publishing the EXTRA newspaper, which helps enhance our students' understanding of the world they live in and the issues facing it. It is an excellent publication.
